Dear Family,

There is a right time for everything and it is time for us to let you know about all that has happened in the last two months with the Lord's work, and the family and our present situation with our support.

In October we were still trying to catch up with our mail, Bible correspondence courses, e-mail, and all that needed my attention in regard to the church work.

In regard to my home Bible studies with Franck and Liva, they are going well and Franck is really growing spiritually and making effort to learn more. I also started a Bible study with Keo on Wednesday afternoons, until the Wednesday night Bible class. My studies by internet with the Khabyl woman from Algeria are doing well. Now she is questioning about the denomination she attends and especially in regard to the speaking and praying in tongues.

The one problem most people that belong to those denominations go more by feeling than by the Scripture. One day she asked me the following "Do you think that I go by my feelings?" I replied "Yes, most of the time you are , and also stressed the fact that in regard to God she needed to rely more in God's word than her feelings." She appreciated my honesty and told me that it was true.

In October we had Brady Smith and his wife Stephanie from the Lord's Church in Lausanne. He held two meetings for us. It started on Saturday afternoons and went through Sunday evening worship. The subjects were "The Christian and Hospitality, and "The Christian and Love for each other and the lost of the world." Everyone enjoyed the classes.

November 11th, 60 members from the congregation went to the annual retreat of the churches of the North in Lille. We were the largest group present, from what we heard.

Rose and I did not go because of Gabrielle's hospitalization with H1N1, pneumonia and bronchiolites. We are thankful unto God and to all of you who have prayed for her and the fact that God has answered all of our prayers. She is home and doing better except for bronchitis.

Everyone that we asked about the retreat they say that they enjoyed the retreat and one surprise guest was present, it was Brother Dale McAnulty former missionary to Lille, France, He just finished several years of mission work in Roumania, and now is returning to the states.

Rose and I and several of the families of the congregation were invited to the Dedeysans home for thanksgiving lunch! I fixed homemade Pumpkin pies. We surely enjoyed our fellowship with everyone and of course all the good food that everyone prepared.

Next month I am planning to go the preacher retreat, since I missed last retreat because of sickness. I have been finishing my French PowerPoint presentation on the book of Revelation and have started another one, titled "The History of the Church through the Centuries".

Here is our financial situation so far. In my last month's report I mentioned that we have lost so far all together \$2833.33 but we will picked up in January \$500 and another \$200 per month, so that would make a total of \$1850 per month, but as of this month we heard that one congregation will cut off their support from \$1165 per month to \$500 in 2010 and another one will stop their support of \$300 at the end of December 2010. So what those it mean? In reality for 2010 we will still be short of \$1950 per month, and this does not include the lost because of the weakness of the Dollar over the exchange rate and neither the inflation and increase of the cost of living.

We are still trusting that God will provide, so we can continue to spread the gospel in the French world.
