

Dear family and friends greetings in the precious name of Jesus.

This will be our last report until we arrive this June to visit you personally.

We wish we had the possibility to come and see you all, because you are dear to our hearts, but unfortunately it won't be possible because of time and distance. When we finished our visit we will have travelled around 14,000 miles, but the miles are nothing when we have to joy to see you in person.

This visit will mark our 10th visit to the states but also our 30th year in the French mission field, thirty blessed years in the service of the Lord and it's our prayer that we will continue for many more years to come. Of course it would not be possible without your love, dedication and dedication to the lost souls of the French world.

Three more precious souls were added to the Lord's Church and Kingdom in May and this first week of June. Rose and I on the 11th of May, drove down to Sermoyer near the town of Tournus, which is 4 hours drive from Paris to spend 3 days with Lucienne Durand Pont which I baptized in her swimming pool! It was wonderful, to see this 65 years lady and devoted Catholic obey the gospel. She has been visiting the church in Lyon once a month.

Upon our return from Sermoyer, Viengkeo Phommaha a Chinese, Laotian, Tahitian man, 48 years old, with whom I have been studying the Bible every week, decided to put on Christ so I baptized him on the 21st and the third baptism was on the 7th of June of Sophia Wiltese the daughter of Brother Roy and Martine Wiltese. We had a record attendance on June 7th at the morning worship; we were a total of 205 present. The most we never had was 180, when I look back when Rose and I first moved to Paris in 1979 attendance was around 30 to 35. To God be the glory for this.

We had the visit of Brother Warren Kirby from Sparta TN from the 21st till the 25th of this month, and we had an enjoyable time together. I even had him preach in French and English for the evening worship, and must say that he did a good job with the French. Until we see you face to face this summer God bless you all.

Email from Cameroon (rec'd June 17, 2009)

Sir,

It always feels good to relate good tidings especially from afar. But let me begin with the sad one. My daughter almost died three days ago if not by God's intervention. The sickness was so abrupt like an unexpected rain in a dry season. A healthy child playing happily around the house suddenly began to vomit and purge simultaneously. Of course acute dehydration was the result. Fever followed and the little girl could not eat for two days because she had to vomit virtually everything she was given, even water and medicines. On Sunday night when I returned from the radio preaching, I did not even rest before I rushed her to a nearby hospital where we were told that the pediatric ward was full and there was no bed to admit Nsikanima. It was already 11 p.m and almost impossible to go anywhere else in search for treatment. In our moment of desperation and sorrow, we had to call our new convert, bro. Edward Ndege who is an experienced nurse. He came and gave her some drip to rehydrate her and God used him to wipe away my tears. The child surged back into life. He and sister Pauline left my house around 2 am that Monday and went home soaked in the rain that was falling that night. So God used a newly saved brother to save our child. Now she is 90% okay as the only problem is lack of strength. The vomiting and purging have ceased and she is eating. Please pray for me because each time something good has happened or about to happen to me, the Devil always try to embitter my life with various temptations. I am fighting a fierce spiritual battle and many knees on the prayer ground will save me from falling. I really need prayers. It is not only sickness, there other significant challenges I'm called to face almost daily.

The good news today is that I have just baptized the son of bro. Edward Ndege. His name is Gerald. he is likely to be in his early twenties. We may well be on the way to experiencing the Cornelius conversion where the whole household accepted the Lord along with him. I have all the baptism pictures now. But I will send them when I am able. Thanks for reading and remember to PRAY for ME.
