His name was Savage. Our proposed outing at Bokkos has been shifted from 15 of March to 10<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> of April. The Nigerian Government fixed the county election that day. It is a dreaded day. We hope nothing will cause us to run up and down as the Moslems want to rule Jos city. Please, keep us in prayers.

Toro are doing well. The Mazah congregation is still trying to get it meeting place done. We solicit for help from the brotherhood so that we can put a roof on the building.
