BERTOUA YOUTH CAMPAIGN TRIP

Earlier in the month I undertook a long distance journey to Bertoua, the capital city of the Eastern province of Cameroon. It was the longest trip I have ever made within the country. The place is so far that it takes 2 days to travel by broad from Limbe. The 3-day



youth program afforded me an opportunity to meet many young Christians in that part of the country. The youths turned out en masse to carry out various soul-reviving activities including evangelism, indoor lectures, fasting, and Bible knowledge competition. At the end of the forum, 6 people were baptized. Bertoua is a Muslim dominated town. The Mile One youth took 2nd position on Fast Bible Opening Competition which trains the youth to learn to open any book of the Bible in 5 seconds or less.

THE CHURCH IN MILE ONE

The seven-year old congregation that meets in Mile One is a steadily growing group of Christians. All of our goals are projected toward having the members committed to the work of the Lord. The weekly attendance record is impressive as can be seen from the picture of the congregation taken after a worship service on Sunday service. Although the non-

availability of a church building continues to debilitate our efforts to move forward as a church, we are nonetheless focused in doing the Lord's work to the best of our ability.
