Introduction

In October the Lord added more blessings to the mission work that He has given us to carry out for his glory. Therefore, I begin by greeting every one of you whose prayers and other forms of support have kept this important mission work on the path of success. EVANGELISM

Since preaching the word to change lives for Christ remains our top priority, the month of October witnessed a number of soul-winning programs that resulted in the salvation of souls. During the month I was empowered by the Lord to move around from house to house to announce the good news of the kingdom to the people of Limbe and other towns. We evangelized many people some of whom have made the decision to attend worship with us.

On the 18th of the month, a soul was added to the Lord's body. I personally immersed Brother Franklin

Thanks you much for the electronic card you sent from the animal Kingdom. It is so natural and beautiful. We are really thankful to God for your love. Please, do include Sandra in prayers as well. She was diagnosed of goiter yesterday in Jos teaching hospital. At the same time, she is having malaria and typhoid. These two are not threatening, because there are sicknesses we contend with daily and we leave with them. She is to undergo further tests so ascertain the level it has reached. One doctor comforted yesterday that it is possible that it will dissolve after the drugs are administered. But you know something with teaching hospital, they will use one as an experimental animal before treatment. Our faith is not in medical knowledge, but in God who gave us life. Keep us in prayers as you always do. Say my love to the Church.
